The weekend of June 7th was the International Hand Launch Festival in Poway, CA. I strongly recommend that everyone visit this annual event even if it is only for one day even if you are not into "hand launch." This year, eighty pilots competed for the unofficial title of "best in the world." The competition was intense. The format was for each pilot to fly 6 ten-minute window flights on Saturday and 4 on Sunday. Then, at the end, the top ten flew 3 to minute window flight for the fly off.

Each round consisted of 3 or 4 tasks that needed to be complete within 10 minutes. There were time penalties included, for example, one was "A two, three, and four minute flight, in any order. Then there was a ten second penalty for each throw after three throws." All the tasks were different as each task was laid out on the each flyers time card. Still, it was very clear what each person's required task was.


The winner was Oleg Golovidov. Oleg is from Russia and has live here in the states for eight years. Oleg is the designer of the Taboo. He came with about six of them, and they all weighed about 10.2 oz each. The Taboo can really deliver the goods.

I met up with a lot of friends and I picked up lots of building tips. If anyone wants detailed pictures of the action, I have lots. I took plenty with my new digital camera and I would love to show them.

The weather was very unusual with heavy, low costal cloud cover, with a light misty rain. However, I was absolutely amazed at many of the pilot's ability to find lift and how they know where to go. A special award was given to Mark Derela for his development work on airfoils which has totally changed hand launch model design.







