A VISIT TO CALIFORNIA SOARING PRODUCTS

SWSA member Paul Ikona has opened California Soaring Products at 1010 N. Citrus Ave., Covina. I have found that CSP is a truly remarkable hobby shop focused on dedicated and committed sailplane enthusiasts as well as those seeking to enter this fascinating hobby.

When I'm asked to describe CSP, the best response that I can give is -- "It's a Radio Control Soaring Digest catalog store!" The last time that I visited CSP, among the many sailplane kits that I saw on the shelves were the following: Ron Vann Prism and Spectrum; F3B Eagle; 2M Slegers/Agnew Vulcan; Inventec Esteem; NSP Monarch; Mark Allen's inverted V-tail twin boom Avenger HLG; and a Clerx Aeronautics Mako. These items include mylar servo covers, flap/aileron linkage fairings, TAUCOM antennas, specialized mini and micro servos, Bag Lady glider bags, and supplies of composites and adhesives. Any items not in stock can also be ordered through Paul saving you the hassle of ordering specialized goods yourself.

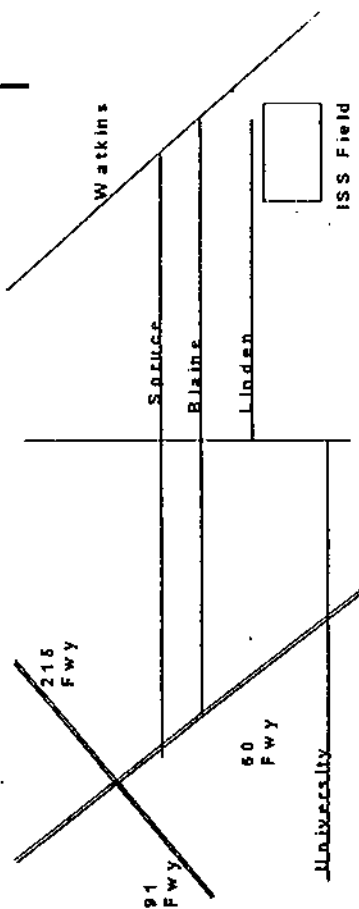
