#### May 1996, THE EDITORS NOTES:

- 1. Another month and all is well behind the looking glass. If any of you think you have trouble getting everything done that your want, just remember Alice conversing with the Red Queen. "We are running ever so fast, but we don't seem to be getting anyplace." "Actually," said the Queen, "we must run as fast as we can just to stay in the same place. If we want to get somewhere, we have to run much faster than that." I guess this applies to flying sailplanes. You must work as hard as you can in order to maintain your high level of skill. But, if you want to get really better, you must work much harder than that. Phew!
- 2. Carnage-a-soar-us! What a trip. Actually, I seem to remember the trip part the most. That is, the many trips up and down the bluff was quite an experience for us "elderly" persons. Still, I really enjoyed the new ideas of Lyn Johansen. I was especially impressed by the idea of "Slope Derby." Having been a once and a while watcher in my youth of Roller Derby, it touched a spot in my Psyche. "I liked it." "It was the real thing, not a fake." Lets do it again.
- 3. What is the best way to launch your Mako? Hold the fuse in front of the wing or hold the boom--Not as easy a choice that you might think. The best flyers in the Club suggest that in front of the wing is best. I think this is most likely true if you are a young and strong "dude." But, maybe not if you are "Old and weak." It appears to me that a good upward throw is necessary for the forward hold location to work well. To simply "drop" your Mako when holding in front of the wing makes a successful launch dependent on your having sufficient line tension at model release, and hoping the winch line does not break just after

you let go. Low tension at this time can result in a very erratic initial climb. On the other hand, when you launch from the boom, while possibly losing a little in the final altitude department, you gain in that as long as you grip the boom securely you get a more stable launch as the model is pulled straight away from you due to the existing line tension. Because you are holding behind the tow hook/CG location, there is a natural the tendency to pull your Mako straight away from you. Also, as fyour Mako is somewhat flat at first, a line break at this critical time will be less likely to leave the model going vertical with little or no airspeed. Besides, I find that with my low arm strength, I can give more impetus to my Mako by putting more body into my throw. (By this, I am not telling you to change the way you launch, but only to say that there is more than one way to launch, especially if one is older and less physically endowed.)

#### Fairview Park Update

On April 10th Messers Dave Nemecek and Larry Tuohino attended the Fairview Park Citizens Advisory Committee to learn about the status of the park development plans Besides the Committee members, also present were Hank Hornsveld and Robert Donnelly, members of the OC Model Engineers, and Keith Van Holt, Costa Mesa Director of Community Services. The Park Committee was very receptive to our attendance and expressed favorable feelings about keeping model glider flying in the park. It was mentioned by the committee chairman, Richard Mehren, that HSS activities were seen as "compatible use" in the current vision to develop a natural park environment.

HSS concerns over the need to mow the grass were brought up by Larry Tuohino. It appeared their primary concern was that we "not mow when the ground is wet". It was suggested we invite the City Ecologist to a HSS club meeting to discuss the environmental concerns. The concept of an HSS storage container like the railroad club was also expressed to the committee. The Committee asked for more information regarding location, size and alternative concepts such as using any available school space. Dave Nemecek spoke about how the HSS club vision has now opened up to include both the slope and thermal interests within the HSS club structure. The Committee seemed to be especially interested in any youth activities we might have planned. They asked for a presentation on the needs and requirements of the park for HSS and Larry Tuohino volunteered to provide such at an upcoming session. The Committee also emphasized the importance of HSS attending a future "citizens comment phase" of the development process which appears to be 2 to 6 months away.

The Committee is currently evaluating various landscape architectural firms for the purpose of solidifying the park master plan. It was obvious the committees desire was to pick a firm experienced in a natural park style of development and restoration. The committee wants to select the firm prior to the next city election from concern a new City Council could lean towards taking a more overdevelopment stance. During the "citizen comment phase", HSS will need the support of every Estancia model airplane flyer, HSS member or not, in order to maximize the likelihood of the slope and thermal interests winning out over the "other competing interests".

Stay tuned for further developments; especially for when your support is needed!

The April monthly was held under a beautiful blue sky. With 25 flyers prepared in the Open Class and 8 more in 2 meter C.D. Mike Aguirre brought everyone together at 9:15 for the pilots meeting. The tasks for the day were 3 rounds of flying with a grab bag style for the flight tasks. Round 1 contained 3.4 and 5 minute tasks which each pilot drew from a can to determine their particular mission, round 2 saw the times move up to 4.5 and 6 minute duration's which was followed the third round for 6.7 and 8 minutes flights. Landing task for all 3 rounds was the 25 foot tape for a 900/100 flight scoring for all times Round I had the event looking pretty tough with times being of no problem but by the time round 2 had been drawn some pilots were starting to find the air a little unfriendly. The third round draws had more surprises with some severe time losses being recorded. The contest completed at about 12:15 with 2 Meter honors going to Joe Rodriguez(1".) Norm Kutch(2".) and Rick Briggs(31d.). In the Open class event Don Ramsey was first Sportsman, Roger Saville finished in the second Sportsman spot. On the Expert side Bill Duncan took first followed by Steve Hendry and Ross Thomas respectively. Masters winner was Mike Aguirre.

Now for the WACKY side of things, as many of you know we have been advertising a SLOPE BASH for sometime now. Larry Tuohino and Lyn Johansen and been the force behind this and WOW was Sunday the day for it to happen!!! For several days the wind was driving out of the south but we were blessed with a great turn in events seeing the wind come around in perfect timing for the slope crew to work their magic Approximately 30 pilots had gathered for this event which included a Hot Dog lunch complete with chips and sodas. Some test flying was just becoming possible at 1:00 with the wind working the rest of the way around by 1:15. 
