




MESSAGE FROM THE OVAL ORIFICE

Fairview Update

Electricity For the Storage Container?

The dynamic duo, Larry Tuohino and Karl Hawley, attended yet another Fairview Citizen's Committee on Sept 16th. A couple of meetings prior we had asked for the permission to sink some holes in the ground to cement in some permanent mountings for elevated turnarounds. The committee had asked us to consult with the City regarding a few issues which led to a meeting out at the field one day where the major issue was the routing of a sewer line to a new restroom that the OC Railroaders were constructing. While asking about the turnaround holes I also brought up the concept of routing electricity to our box so we could leave the batteries charging on site....perhaps a Coke machine and workbench light could also be added.

The City Parks Dept. seemed OK with this concept and asked us to draw up a plan for Planning Commission Review (who was also there that morning). So what does the HSS membership think? The cost of the project for materials is approx. \$200 to \$500 and involves laying pipe with wire to our box and perhaps installing a fume-booth inside to route outside the hydrogen from the charging process. Perhaps some of our members have some of this stuff hanging around to donate? Obviously the cost/benefits of this project may be lost if HSS has to move to a new location within the overall Park Master Plan, but who knows when that will actually happen and at that time there may be outside funds available to tap into for something bigger and even better! We would want to do our project at the same time as the sewer project (this winter probably) so we need to get started now on the presentations and paperwork. Dick Panzer and I think we can do it if the club members get behind it with labor, materials, and...money o we need another "field improvements" fund drive to handle the cost?

Karl also brought up a request that Will had made earlier of the committee regarding getting another portapotty out in our location. The City got back to me this week and indicated that the cost would be about \$91 a month that HSS would have to absorb. My thought is the electricity is more important and a nice walk for "mother nature" to the current locations is not a bad bit of exercise for a few of us "workbench potatoes". Again something that could be discussed at a General Meeting...give us your thoughts! Foundations

No not for your house or your girlfriend...for the Park. The City is considering setting up a legal foundation to facilitate giving of funds to support various projects, one of which could be Fairview Park improvements. Gifts could be earmarked for rather specific projects....like glider flying facilities. No need to rewrite your Last Will &Testament just yet (keep a tickin' Gordie and Dick) but to roll it around in your mind. Someday HSS may need some significant funds to build the clubhouse/storage/museum of our dreams and this may be the financial tool that gets up there. Let me know if you have any interest in this concept as it will take some focused effort to develop into reality.






The Scale festival is on Sept 19,1998.

Last month while attending the Mid Winter Electric's in San Diego, I happened to meet a gentleman who was showing another flyer his partially completed airframe. It turned out to be Bob Sliff. I mentioned that my next project was going to be an old-timer and that I had ordered plans. I told him hat I was not looking forward to cutting individual foils on an elliptical wing with a transitional airfoil. While I was aware that he sold kits, I didn't know that he sold partial kits and in fact he sold a kit of the particular airplane I was going to build. He didn't have any of his info with him and I was leaving so I gave him a handful of money, and asked him to send what he thought I could use. I may be that my mother taught me to be nice or that I'm Canadian or that I've always been unbelievable lucky, but I trust people and I've never been ripped off by a fellow modeler.

When I got home last week, the package from Bob was waiting for me. Two things struck me immediately. First, he added stuff to the order which has to have cost him more than I paid him and secondly, I'VE NEVER SEEN SUCH QUALITY. Beautiful clear, light wood, all without cracks or blemishes and all pre-sanded. In a mass production scenario you might be able to do this and sell the product for this price but not on a limited run. To be honest I still don't know how he makes his kits (trade secret he tells me) but I do know that he isn't paying himself enough.

I believe Bob epitomizes the majority of our suppliers. They don't do it for the money, they add significant value to their products and they can be relied upon to treat customers fairly. Sorry if I rambled on but I think it's time to accentuate the positive aspects of these gentleman.
