

February, 1988 Meeting Minutes

The meeting was brought to order by president George Joy, at 7:35 pm on February 3, 1988 at our usual meeting place in Costa Mesa. The meeting minutes of the January, 1988 meeting were approved and voted into the record by the club members in attendance. The treasurers report was provided by Chris Hurley, and voted and approved. To date there are 69 paid-up members in the club.

New Face:

Dick Moore, Dan Skadal, John Lassater, Fred Hesse, and Jerret Stalls were introduced to the club.

Old Business:

The election for General Director was opened by Will Conrad. The reason for the reelection was as described in the last newsletter. No additional names were nominated, which left Bob Sliff and Frank Chasteler as the two nominees. The election was held, although Frank was absent due to the flu. Bob Sliff was elected.

Contest Director Dieter Lamprecht proposed that the June contest date, as published in February newsletter, be changed from the 5th to the 12th. A motion to accept the contest dates as published, including the June change was made and passed. It was noted that the $(SC)^2$ contest dates would be finalized at the February 12th $(SC)^2$ meeting. The four contest rule changes published in the February newsletter were voted on and passed as follows: 1) the monthly club contest would be held separately from the $(SC)^2$ contest and on different dates. 2) two meter airplanes will be flown at the same time as open class. 3) the last three contests of the year will be 3, 5, or 7 minute flights with the landing being the CD's option. 4) A minimum of eight contests will be flown to count towards the end of year standings. If 12 contests are held and flown, 4 low contest scores can be dropped. The club voted to have the club $(SC)^2$ contest on September 25th.

A recent article from the Register news paper was circulated at the club meeting. It described our flying site and a plan by the city to put a small train in the park and allow hang gliding along the slope. Mr Dan Skadal, representing the Orange County Hang Glider Association, attended our meeting and stated that the city parks and recreation people had told him that he should talk with our club about getting our agreement to allow them to fly off the slope. Will Conrad was asked to talk with Mr. Skadal and obtain more information and report back at the next club meeting.

A motion was made by Bob Sliff to hold the Astro Champs contest this year on June 18th & 19th. The motion passed.

The cancelled January contest was rescheduled for February 21st. Bob Sliff will be the CD. Dieter Lamprecht id the CD for the February 7th contest. The first round will be a three minute duration, the second round will be a seven minute man-on-man, and the third round will be a five minute duration. All three landings will be a 25 foot tape within a cone.

A motion was made to buy another club retriever, with a maximum of \$250 to be spent. Dick Panzer volunteered to build the retriever.


Bob Sliff handed out last years end of the year trophies.

The meeting was finally closed and turned over to Helen Olsen, who discussed the League of Silent Flight (LSF) goals and rules. Applications were handed out, and T-shirts and decals sold.

MARCH CLUB CONTEST

The March club contest will be held on Sunday March 6th, at Mack Freed Field, home of the Harbor Soaring Society. Pete Richardson Will be the contest director. The contest should start at 9:00 am. The Contest Director has the last word in all disputes.

- Round 1: The first round will consist of a two minute precision flight. The scoring will be 500 flight points and 500 landing points. The flight points will be scored per the bell curve in the AMA rule book, that is zero flight points for flight times outside of 2 minutes ± 30 seconds. The landing will be on a standard 25' radius circle.
- Round 2 & 3: Rounds two and three are the same task. The pilot has the choice of two flights, ten minutes and five minutes. Flights six minutes and over will be scored per the ten minute score table. The ten minute flight will be scored 950 flight points and 50 landing points. The flight points will be awarded at 1.58 points per second and the landing will be on the standard 25' radius circle. The five minute flight will be scored 700 flight points and 300 landing points. The flight points will be awarded at 2.33 points per second. The landing will be on the landing circle in the figure.
