Twenty-two pilots flew the first contest for 1986. That is a pretty good show considering five of our contest regulars had other commitments. We were rained out on January 3 so the contest was held the following Sunday, January 12. The weather was beautiful, with visibility and ceiling unlimited. Soaring conditions were fair to good with near zero sink early in the morning for the first round. The wind began to pick up a little by 11:00 and the lift was spotty, but was there if you worked for it. Five 7-minute flights were completed in the first round by just cruising at minimum sink. Two of our good pilots lost their ships. It always hurts when you lose a plane because it is a creation and extension of yourself. It can happen to any of us.

Herman Hall announced at the pilots meeting that winners would be awarded paper trophies. Do all you guys realize how much money we would build up in the treasury if we flew for paper trophies? Don Manning likes the idea. Gordon Ritschke was ready for the contest with his Mark 8 - Mod 0 thermal sensor eyeglasses and Bob Gerbin showed up with his version of the Hughes Spruce Goose. Steve Dow and Don Manning worked hard at the score-table taking renewal applications, checking AMA cards and keeping score. By the time the third round was completed, Frank Chasteler and Bob Gerbin had both flown three 7-minute rounds and Jack Durham walked with a "paper trophy" for first place overall with his "Windsong."

I believe this type of contest where the pilot has his choice of a 3, 5, or 7-minute round is different, fun, and exciting. The pilot has to plan ahead by evaluating lift conditions, then make decisions and fly accordingly. The timer is a second set of eyes for you and he can give you information, but it is the pilot who decides whether or not to go for 3, 5,

or 7 minutes. Sometimes we can get greedy or use poor judgment or a combination of both and completely bomb out!

We have some new members at the field. Be sure to give them words of encouragement once in a while. We all need that at times. In closing, I want to remind you of the Rose Bowl Soaring Festival at the Rose Bowl on March 16 and 17. It is two days of really fun contest flying sponsored by the Pasadena Soaring Society. Register by mail before February 10. Registration forms are included in this newsletter.

EEBRUARY THERMAL CONTEST

- Five flights of 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 minutes each. <u>Called flight order</u> and <u>flight time</u>.
- Precision landing, all flights 100 landing points. Landing is to be within the standard 25-foot circle, as measured with the standard landing tapes.
- 3. Flight scoring (All flights 500 points maximum):
 - 1 minute flight 10 points off/second over or under 1 minute
 - 2 minute flight 8 points off/second over or under 2 minute
 - 3 minute flight 6 points off/second over or under 3 minute
 - 4 minute flight 4 points off/second over or under 4 minute
 - 5 minute flight 2 points off/second over or under 5 minute
- 4. All launches must be by winch. Full winch launch is not required.

- A) 3-MINUTE FLIGHT OF 700 POINTS, 4 POINTS/SEC. OFF 3 MINUTES, LANDING AT 300 POINTS.
- B) 5-MINUTE FLIGHT OF 800 POINTS, 3 POINTS/SEC. OFF 5 MINUTES, LANDING AT 200 POINTS.
- C) 7-MINUTE FLIGHT OF 900 POINTS, 2 POINTS/SEC. OFF 7 MINUTES, LANDING AT 100 POINTS.

Each flight will be judged to the closest of 3, 5, or 7 minutes. Time need not be called prior to landing. The time will speak for itself. Landing is to be within the standard 25-foot circle.

- 6. The board recommended that the club keep the masters class.
- 7. Club contest fees for 1986 will be:

\$2.00 members below masters class, \$1.00 masters class, \$2.00 visit without trophy, \$4.00 visitor with trophy.
