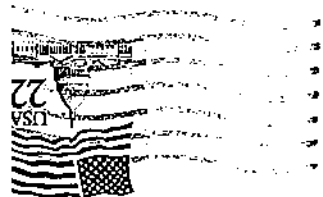

A RETURN TRIP TO VISALIA

Off again to Visalia's famous fall soaring classic. We left Friday afternoon with about a million other people, all exiting the area on I-5 at the same time. Upon our arrival, the following week, at the field in Visalia we found that many pilots had been there for several days already setup and practicing for the contest. It was at this point that we noticed the entire front row in the viewing area was filled, with the exception of one space at the very end, about five miles from the benches. It was also noticed at this time the landing area those guys were practicing on was a strange cone shaped thing that started with something big and finished with something small. It turned out that something big was 50 points and something small was 150 points.
