- March Contest -

Our Vice President(you know, the guy who was smart enough to go for the softest job on the roster), Kirk Hanson, is the lucky contest director for the March event. The Meet is to be held on Sunday, March 11, at 9:00 A.M. (Kirk will never make it, folks). The tasks are to be three rounds of 7 or 10 minute (who gets to choose?) precision duration- man on man style. A standard landing spot, within a 50 foot circle, will be worth 10% of the flight score if 50 or above and 5% of flight points if 1 through 49 points are on the tape. With Kirk's reputation, he will have to allow late sign-ups (up to 15 minutes after contest starts). Come out and enjoy yourself, and good luck .

- April Contest April Contest will be 3 rounds to make 15 minutes, no round more than 7 minutes. The best of three landings will be scored.

President's Corner-

The first contest of the year for H.S.S. was held on Feb. 11th. Even with a delay for the fog, till 10:10 A.M., the contest was over by 12:20 P.M. A call to fly in groups of 5 was used with a 5 minute to launch time limit. The contestant could call his task to fly 1 minute into the flight. The three tasks for the contest were 3,5, and7 minute prec. duration, 900/100 with standard landing circle inside a qualifing area. This type of contest works like a man on man with scoring much easier than the man on man method. One interesting note was that with 60 flights and 2 relaunches, there. were 71 line retrievals turned in. The contest was co CDed by Mike Costello and myself.

- Contest Classification -

At the Harbor Soaring Society Board meeting the following was established as the criteria to be used for contest classification for 1979.

- There shall be two flying classifications based upon performance in club contests; that is, Sportsman and Expert.
- 2. Classification for 1979 will use club contest results from Jan 1977 to the present as follows:
 - A) Expert- Normalized scores of at least 5 contests with a score of 750 or better. Non-Club contestants will be placed in this class.
 - B) Sportsman- Did not have 5 contests with a normalized score of 750 or more. New members are in this class.
 - C) A contestant may place oneself into the Expert class.
- 3. A Sportsman will be moved to the Expert Class when he has had 5 contests with a normalized score of 750 or more, or when he has had three contests in a row above 750.
- 4. The following members are in the Expert Class. All others are in Sportsman.
