FROM THE PRESIDENT

I helped out on Saturday and it is nice not to have any launch equipment problems. I attended the SC2 contest on Sunday and it went very well also. The attendance was also down and the contest was completed before 1 PM. Lift for all the contests last month appeared to be very spotty, sometimes you got it and sometimes you didn't.

As most of you are aware, we are in good standings with the city of Costa Mesa. The city has approved of our use of the field, and has even set up an area of the new park just for us to use. We don't want to do anything to jeopardize this arrangement. The AMA has had articles discussing the loss of flying fields throughout this country. We don't want to be one of those statistics.
