

Electric Corner

Welcome to the first installment of Electric Corner. With the recent good news from our City Council meetings and support from our Costa Mesa Council Members, we have been given a very special privilege to enjoy our electric models at Fairview Park along side the sailplane pilots. We have made the promise to be a good neighbor to local residents and be cohesive to other park activities. We must always remember that to be allowed to fly in the space that we do is a very rare opportunity considering the lack of flying space here in Southern California and especially Orange County. Open land like this is priceless and the fact that Costa Mesa wants to prevent more peach stucco homes stacked all over it's vast expanse like the rest of Orange County is reason to be very happy!! The club is the lobbying institution for the modelers to continue communication to and from our City Council with regards to the development of the park in it's quest to provide a safe, natural, clean park for local residents to enjoy for years to come. It is important to note that the Harbor Soaring Society is not exclusive to sailplanes and enjoys a diverse group of people who participate in many disciplines of aeromodeling. Many of the sailplane pilots are indeed electric enthusiasts and take part in many of the club's activities. With the growth spurt of electric activity at the field in the last couple of years, it is essential that we keep focused on our goals to fly responsibly and serve as good role models to new people who join in on the fun. Many pilots who are specifically geared towards electric flight are joining our club and that is a welcomed sight. There is no better way to provide a line of communication to the modelers who use Fairview Park than through an organized club such as HSS. A club can provide information, resources for instruction, and a basis for proper field etiquette at a field as sensitive as ours. We have the task to police ourselves when it comes to flying in the proper areas, flying safely, and limiting the impact we have on our beautiful park (i.e. noise, trash, and other park users). We will address these issues for many months to come and it all starts here and now before it is too late.

For now I want to leave you with a few things to start practicing as we head into many more discussions on electric flight:

- Fly with a spotter whenever possible. Having another set of eyes to help you land and warn you of any obstacles or approaching pedestrians can be the difference between a safe approach or a broken airplane after you have to ditch it to avoid something.
- Learn how to balance your propellers properly to maximize efficiency and prevent any excessive noise. You are only robbing yourself of power when your prop is rattling and vibrating your airframe, not to mention the nuisance it causes when that sound travels. This goes to noisy gearboxes as well. Keeping your gearbox greased and meshed properly prolongs the life of the equipment and prevents any excessive noise. Remember that sound carries a long ways at altitude and we want to be as unnoticeable to residents as possible.
- Taking from the note above, we want to keep as much of the electric flying to the east of the parking lot and school whenever possible. Many pilots like to launch directly in front of the parking lot and use the area out front, sometimes encroaching on the airspace near the homes. This is a very bad idea and common sense tells us that this is not a good thing for our concerns with keeping a quiet flying field for the immediate residents. (I use to be one of those residents and yes the sound does carry when the plane is close to the houses!) If you have a noisier-than-average model (flying wings, ducted fans, etc), keep it even further away from the houses as best you can.
- Just like on our highways, pedestrians have the right away. Many casual strollers of the park may be unfamiliar with our activity and don't understand the intricacies to the operation of a model airplane so always be patient and polite. As an example: wait an extra 30 seconds for a jogger or family out for a stroll to pass through your expected take off route. Buzzing over their head to get up in the air quick is not a responsible move and waiting another 30 seconds isn't going to make any difference to the flight of your model.
- Be considerate of the winch line areas when they are up and operational. Watch and listen for pilots launching their models and pay attention to the towline as it goes up and down. There is generally only a small window in the day for the sailplane pilots to have good weather to fly and the rest of the day is wide open for other pilots. We have successfully shared the field together for over 10 years and will continue to do so for many more.
- Be a good ambassador for our field and remember to say hello to other park users as they enjoy Fairview Park. It's a beautiful spot and great to be out enjoying it no matter what you are doing. Until next time.

Chris Adamczyk will author a cover letter and then Karl Hawley will fax Mr. Hesse's proposal to the AMA for review by their legal department.

Old minutes that are still current.




