



MESSAGE FROM THE OVAL ORIFICE



Orange County Residents Are Top R/C Glider Pilots Internationally

Every two years the FAI, the world governing board for all aviation from kites to 747's, sponsors a series of world aviation championships. This includes model aviation activities often known as "Radio Control Soaring". Individuals after winning at the US Team Trials level, are sent by the US Academy for Model Aeronautics as a team to compete internationally. R/C model sports in foreign countries are often subsidized and USA teams usually face strong competition with a large number of spectators. Like the Olympics, Gold, Silver, and Bronze Metals are awarded.

Orange County was very well represented on this years USA Team and this OC group did better than ever for the US. OC residents Ben Clerx, Larry and Chris Jolly, Troy Peterson, Bob Sliff, and Jerry Bridgeman, all were on various USA teams completing in F3J, F5E and F5D events. Additionally, teammates Brian Buaas, Thomas Pils, Joe Wurts, and Steve Nue live in S. California.

F3J was held in Upton Severn, England and the F5 events at an old Mig fighter base at Neuhardenberg in the former East Germany in mid-August. Team members, many who belong to Harbor Soaring Society- a local OC R/C glider club, have been practicing at the City of Costa Mesa's new Fairview Park since the last world championships two years ago.

The USA F3J team of Clerx, Skip Miller, and Joe Wurts came in first place as a team against 80 flyers representing 26 countries. Joe took 1st, Skip 4th and Ben 9th individually. The under 18 year Junior team of Chris Jolly, Dustin Miller, and Nathan Evans placed 4th as a team.

The USA F5E team of Thomas Pils, Jerry Bridgeman, and Steve Neu came in 2nd overall with Thomas and Jerry taking 1st and 2nd individually. Thomas finished 2 laps ahead of everyone else. The German team took first.

The USA F5D team of Larry Jolly, Troy Peterson, and Brian Buass took 2nd place in the team event.

F3J is a towline glider competition requiring teamwork to launch, soar, and land the model within certain strict parameters. F5E is an electric motor boosted glider which can hit speeds in excess of 130 mph and is judged on pylon laps, soaring ability, and landing. F5D is compact racer built solely for speed around the pylon course and is raced nose to nose in 3 plane heats.

Team members can be available for interviews and pictures. A reception, sponsored by Harbor Soaring Society, for the returning team will held at 7pm on Tuesday Sept 1st at a location to be announced. 

1998 F3J World Championships

Once again, the Americans are the first ever WCs for a new soaring event, following in Skip Millers footsteps, along with Dale Nutter and Lemon Payne (I'm going from old memory, so I might be wrong here with the third name...). We posted very good scores, and as it turned out, we had the team championship wrapped up without even flying the last round!

I'd like to thank all of the people that made our effort a good and successful one, and in particular, John Roe. He really worked hard to make sure that we were competitive in the "organic" winch wars that is inherent in F3J at present, making sure that we had suitable line, good tow equipment, and good techniques. He also did a great fund raiser in his dynamic soaring video, which really made a big difference in the team funding. Also, Ben Clerx spent quite a bit to make sure that we had plenty of hand tow reels, pulleys, and all of the necessary hardware to insure that we were ready to do battle with the more experienced Europeans. Emmett/Robert Jolly/Eikenhorst (he goes by any combination of the above evidently) worked very well with John to fill out our towing team, towing for both juniors and seniors without a hitch, making sure that every launch was a good one. Our team manager, Jim McCarthy did a great job in organizing the teams logistics, with suitable vehicles, accommodations, and travel stuff that worked very well.

Skip Miller did a great job with the junior team during the early practice session, helping out his son Dusty, Nathan Evans, and Chris Jolly until George Joy, the Jr. assistant team manager arrived. Larry Jolly, the Jr. team manager was delayed in arriving until the day before the WCs, as he was busy earning a top ten placing at the electric pylon WC held in Germany. The juniors all flew very well, and really seemed to enjoy the international experience. As Chris is only 13, and Dusty is 15, expect those two to be in contention for the next Jr. F3J WC in Greece, Whereas I expect Nathan to do battle to gain a stot on

the next Sr. team. Sal of NSP did a grand gesture in donating a molded Psyko for a raffle to benefit the Jr. team.

George's wife, Jo, quickly jumped into the scoring process, recording scores and working the Tx impound for the full week. For those of you that do not know her, she seems to always giving support to making sure that a contest runs smoothly, preliminary rounds with a total of only one point lost between them. Quite impressive. In fact, we had five Americans in the fly-offs! Skip was on track to win the flyoffs, but on his last landing, had the misfortune of being a bit too accurate in

has placement, and skipped off of the "pie-plate" marking the 100 spot, putting him down to a 95 landing and dropping him down to a close second place. Dusty of course, won the Junior event in Interglide by a large margin with superb flying.

We had a great showing in the "warm-up" contest before the F3J WCs, the BARCS Interglide. Skip and Dusty led in the As to the contest itself, it has been, and will be written about in many different places. It was a hard fought battle in quite a wide variety of soaring conditions, much of which was extremely challenging. I am quite proud of my flying during the preliminary rounds. It has been (and still is) my opinion that whoever wins the preliminary rounds really wins the contest, at least until the rules change a bit. The flyoffs (all two of them), were really won by the Canadian Arend Borst, who was the only one that made a full flight time for both slots. He was unfortunately penalized on one landing due to an unfortunate circumstance, thereby letting me sneak into first place.

Much of the European planes flown were three piece wings with spans near 130" and with V tails. Almost all of them looked quite similar, very good performance, but different from the US norm.

As to the American team, Ben Clerx flew primarily his Esprit, with Daryl's Psyko as his alternate that he flew in the first two rounds. He did a superb job flying out a pop-off from about 50 feet in very light air in the first round. Skip flew two older Emeralds to very good effect. It was amazing to see just how much performance he could wring from them. I flew two Diamonds, one of which was my primary model from the last F3B WC in Turkey, and the other was a newly built and very light version that had a beautiful Kevlar wing made by Gordon Jennings. It is really cool to have an F3B capable ship that is less than 2 kg!

All in all, it was a great experience. The contest ran very well with a minimum of problems, neglecting the needless destruction that comes from mass simultaneous launches. (Yes, I have some opinions here, but I'll save them until another time). The contest organization did a superb job, we had an excellent site that was only a five minute walk from town, and we didn't even get rained on much at all!

It is really cool that we have World Champions in both soaring disciplines right here in the USA! Of course, all I'm looking forward to right now is to get back to Parker and do some serious foamie flying... :-)





Fairview Park Report

Acting to clear up concerns about deficiencies HSS had identified in the Fairview Park Master Plan, Karl Hawley and Larry Tuohino appeared before the Park Citizen Committee on Aug 19th to express HSS concerns over safety, trees in the landing pattern, elevated turnarounds and our general location in the Park Master Plan. This action was critical because the Plan as written had already been approved by the City Council and there was some concern there could be no further changes to the plan.

The result was again positive to HSS with the Committee voting unanimously to involve HSS and request the architects to take a re-look at HSS needs when the actual construction plans are finalized. This next step may be years away as no money has yet been identified for the third master plan's development but for now HSS needs are on the official record!




