


HSS-(SC)2 Hand Launch Contest

SAFETY

At the last contest Steve Addis had his Hera go down after launch. The Hera launched fine with a little zoom, proceeded out over the slope and completed some circles. After a minute or so, the model entered an uncontrolled spiral. We saw the model impact near the slope and feared the worst. We were encouraged to see Steve bring his Hera back in one piece. Damage was substantial, and the wing will have to be replaced. When Steve pulled the nose off, the cause of the crash could be seen immediately. Like many of us, Steve's Hera has a servo connector for the battery power instead of a switch. The lead on this model was a little long and had become entangled on the elevator clevis. As the elevator was actuated, the clevis worked through the insulation on the wire and nuked the battery pack. Always remember to secure all items in your model. Our gliders can sustain High G-forces on launch and things can find them selves loose floating around the interior of your model. While your at it, make sure that you give your model a good inspection after you have a hard landing. Things can happen, and I hate to see someone loose a model unnecessarily. Larry
