

THERMAL HUNTING - PART 1


As the title suggests, this series of articles will give you techniques that should help you max every flight you make, whether it be during competition or practice. Of course, all this reading won't be as good as having some of the more proficient pilots coach or time for you when you fly. It's sort of like having Arnold Palmer standing next to you with ready advice as you hack your way through 18 holes of golf.

To be a successful thermal hunter one needs to have the right attitude (altitude helps also) - always believe that there is lift out there somewhere. Air is almost always moving either up or down. Fly your plane fast, out of the down air and circle slowly in rising air. It's that simple. Spend a little time watching hawks and seagulls, they'll show you how it is done better than any pilot.

Much has been written on search patterns and techniques for locating thermals, so I'll be brief on this subject. Recent magazine articles by Fred Weaver, Bob McGowen and others are very good (ed. note: a series of books on soaring techniques by Dennis Pagen is also very good, if you can find them). A book by Dave Thornburg, Old Buzzard's Soaring Book (I believe is the title) is very educational and entertaining.

In a nutshell: keep the plane moving along your search pattern and cover as much sky as possible without searching the same air twice. Remember, you have to go out and find the thermals, they won't come to you. If other planes are climbing in lift, your problem is solved. If other planes are not in lift, there's no point in searching that part of the sky. Have your timer monitor their progress while you search another area. The ten minutes prior to launch should be spent watching other planes. When you launch, you should have a pretty good idea where to go. When flying at a strange field, talk to the local pilots about where the hot spots are (also watch where they go to make certain you haven't been set up for a wild goose chase).

Next month: how to make your plane cover more sky in search of thermals. Till then, good hunting.


Format: Three round add-em-up. 20 minute total. Only <u>even whole minutes</u> (eg. 2, 4, 6) will be counted.

ELECTRIC/SAILPLANE TEAM CONTEST

On June 23rd the Harbor Soaring Society will hold their 1ST ANNUAL (hopefully) ELECTRIC/SAILPLANE TEAM CONTEST. This will be a team event where each team will be made up of one electric pilot and one sailplane pilot.

TASK:

Task will be a 30 MINUTE ADD-EM-UP consisting of 6 flights with no individual flight over 7 minutes. Each flight will be flown to the nearest minute. Electrics will receive 25 landing bonus points for landing within a standard landing circle, sailplanes will receive landing bonus points according to where they land on a standard 100 point landing tape. Both the electric and the sailplane will fly 3 flights each. The electric will fly all three flights on ONE charge. The sailplane will be launched from 12V club winches. Flight points will be awarded 1 point per second of flight time (not including motor run on the electric). A pilot may only enter on one team and each team must consist of two individuals.

ELECTRIC REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Any type of electric model may be entered. Sailplane, old timer, trainer, what ever the pilot feels comfortable with.
- 2. Maximum number of cells allowed in the battery pack will be 7.
- 3. NO 1700 SCE or 1800 SCR cells are permitted. Winners batteries will be subject to a discharge check.
- 4. The electric model may have any number of functions.

SAILPLANE REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Sailplanes cannot have any type of power device to augment flight.
- 2. Sailplane can be any size from hand launch to cross country.
- 3. Sailplane may have any number of functions.
- 4. NO metal skids will be permitted.


