

#### June Contest Report

On the 9th of June, CD Frank Chasteler opened the June HSS monthly with detailed rules for the day: 3 rounds addem-up, 20 minutes total, only even whole minutes count, standard 100 point landing tape. Flight times used as factor of 3 to compute flight points. a perfect score was 1200 secs. X 3, plus 3 100 point landings: 3900 points. this format was quite a change from the standard 3-5-7 format and created some interesting tactical situations.

Weather conditions were quite good all day, with many long flights recored in the early rounds under calm and gray skies. Morry Smith decided to complete all his flying in the first round, flying a 20 minute flight with a good landing; this tactic dispensed with 200 possible landing points in rounds 2 and 3 but took advantage of good early lift.

As the skies cleared around mid-day, lift got to be quite strong but so did the down air. Wind direction remained favorable for westerly spot landings all day.

Some statistics: 16 entrants in Two-Meter, 14 in Open Sportsman, 6 in Open Advanced, and 20 in Open Expert. Frequency jam-ups were not bad with 3 fliers on channel 30 in Two-Meter and 3 fliers on 38 in Open.

When the flying was complete, Tony Martin took first in Two-Meter with his modified Snipe. Pete Richardson was second with his Sagitta 600 and George Joy took third with a Gnome.

In Open Sportsman, newsletter editor and first-time competitor John Ostrowski took first with his Paragon (don't ask about his 2M scores) (You got that right-Ed.), and Dan Lair took seconf with an Aquila. Flying as a Sportsman, Bryan Joy won Advanced with his LJMP Pantera and moved to Advanced. Brian Germane was second in Advanced with a Gemini. Great flying from both the B's, both Juniors!

In Open Expert, Rich Garner took third with his Cheetah. Tony Martin and Blair Atwell tied for first at the end of three rounds. Tony and Blair flew a two-minute precision flyoff round. Tony took first in his white composite Two-meter

ship on the basis of landing points - time was again a tie. Blair finished second with his Super Plank. Two firsts for Tony, outstanding.

Overall, good flying conditions, good flights, and a good time was had by all.

#### DAWN TO DUSK CHALLENGE



Division 2:

Rudder/Elevator only (spoilers ok)

No size limit

No wing-loading limit 6 laps, around 2 pylons

The following rules apply to both divisions:

3 Rounds of competition, plus fly-offs for ties

4 planes per heat maximum

1st. place finisher in each heat is timed

In the event of a frequency conflict in a fly-off, each pilot may be required to fly for time if no other solution exists

All pilots must be current A.M.A. members

All models must display pilot's A.M.A. number (minimum 1 inch high)


All radios must be 1991 Gold-stickered

Exit I 405 at the Harbor Blvd. Exit, proceed south on Harbor Blvd.


Make a RIGHT turn on Adams Ave., heading west.
