
On Tuesday February 18, 2003 at Costa Mesa City Hall, the meeting to finalize the Fairview Park master plan was held. Several areas of the park were still in question including the Harbor Soaring Society (HSS) flying site. Several HSS officers were in attendance as well as several club members. Thank you to those who showed support for your club.


Flash-back: over the last several months, the flying site and what it would look like, both in size and shape had been in question. At one point in the dialog with the city, the proposed site had become too small to allow safe take-offs and an appropriately sized landing area. Sensing the immediacy of the issue, the president of HSS, Karl Hawley, and Roger McGregor met with city officials to voice concerns over the reduced site boundaries. These talks negotiated a flying site that would be large enough to accommodate all flyers. The new site, if approved, would be located on one side of the path, rather than being split into two separate areas by the path, a safety concern that needed to be addressed.

Flash-forward: the meeting at city hall was quite a victory for HSS and all those involved in the behind-the-scenes dialog with the city. The city showed its support by voting unanimously to work with HSS to ensure that all aspects of the project meet our needs. Further, in talks with the architect from David Evans & Associates, they will keep the dialog open to create a great flying site. Let's hope that we have closed this chapter and will move onto the construction phase as money becomes available to be budgeted for our new flying site.

An Open Letter to the Membership of Harbor Soaring Society


The Harbor Soaring Society (HSS) club has the oldest R/C Soaring Club charter in AMA. This is a greater achievement than you would expect. It has required a lot of time and commitment by a relatively few individuals. Their service was generally thankless and driven by a love of the activity. The current situation in HSS is a very sad one. A once very proud, energetic, high achieving club has degenerated into a group of celebrity flyers and a large number of "I don't care as long as I get to Fly" members. Celebrity flyers are typically those who have reached a high level of achievement in our sport and by their actions appear to feel that they are not expected to help out in any way. The club should be "honored" to have them present at our field and using the equipment. The "I don't care as long as I get to Fly" group are to a large part made up of the group that has migrated from Mile Square Park but certainly is not limited to those individuals. They certainly represent the largest population at the field. To my knowledge I have never seen any of them at club meetings or helping in any club or park activities. The club roster has over 100 members, but currently only 6 or so, show up for meetings. Many times club officers are not even present.

Why is this happening? Some of the responsibility falls on the shoulders of the current officers and perhaps some of the prior ones. But to the greatest extent the problem lies with the membership. As long as we can fly our planes (some people say toys) and use the equipment to launch our sailplanes we really don't feel obligated to put any effort into club activity. We don't have any respect for the effort and funds that went into winches, turn-arounds, retrievers or the other equipment and facilities. Or "I don't use the darn equipment, because I fly electrics, why should I be concerned"? Nor do we care that some one else takes their time to attend local government meetings to represent us and protect our privilege to fly on Costa Mesa park property. "I pay my dues, so what's the problem."

The problem is if the Harbor Soaring Society ceases to exist there is no longer a single coherent voice to represent us with the organization that holds our flying future in its hands. Does that mean that we are going to lose the ability to fly in Fairview Park? Not today. But two other long time flying organizations have lost their fields this year. The Pasadena Soaring Society and the Soaring Union of Los Angeles. In both cases it was caused by sporting organizations that basically showed "better utilization" of the open area. Making the HSS a presence to local government is really about making it a strong organization with active membership. This requires a larger number of members to handle the load. This requires attendance and participation at the monthly meetings.

This is where the responsibility transfers to the club officers. The meetings have to be more than hearing the latest gripes about noise or planning the next contest. A lot of people don't like to fly in sailplane contests so there must be other club activities for them. More "show & tell" by members needs to be encouraged, sailplane and electric types. Guest speakers need to be contacted and reminded to show up. Would a new meeting place, more centralized, make it easier for members to attend? Would a raffle of useful modeling supplies, done on a consistent basis, help attendance? And most important of all can a newsletter be sent out that tells of activities, giving recognition to all types of club members, their efforts and contributions.

Look at it this way – If we, the people who fly at Fairview Park, don't take an active interest in protecting our privilege to fly there – who will.





Master Plan of Parks and Open Space

The 2002-2003 Open Space Master Plan of Parks and Recreation provides a comprehensive review of the recreation programs and facilities in Costa Mesa. The Master Plan process has involved a significant amount of community input, from four well-attended workshops to a statistically random telephone survey. This process provides for a balanced assessment of the recreational needs of the City based on community desires. The Master Plan will guide recreational planning during the next five years.

Both the Planning Commission, and Parks and Recreation Commission have reviewed the Master Plan. The Parks and Recreation Commission adopted the document at the November 20, 2002 meeting. Upon approval by the City Council the Open Space Master Plan of Parks and Recreation will be implemented.

The Master Plan document can be viewed on the City website at www.ci.costa-mesa.ca.us, and is available at all City recreational facilities, the Newport Mesa Unified School District, and both Costa Mesa libraries.
