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




# Harbor Soaring Society General Field Rules and Field Safety Rules

- Do not fly at low altitude or make high speed passes over the pit area.
- All winch launching shall be in a westerly direction from the launch area. Electric powered models
  will be launched/ROG'd to the north of the winch launch area in a westerly, northerly,
  or easterly direction.

#### Exceptions:

- Relocation of the pits and iaunch area to the western end of the field.
- b. In the event of south winds, electric powered models may be launched to the south or east, provided launching is not over the pit area and the launching direction is clear of people.
- 3. All pilots shall fly standing in the area between the winches and the landing area, or to the north (well clear of the winches), and west of the landing area line. Pilots must keep out of the landing area except when retrieving their planes.
- 4. All low level approaches to landing shall be from the north and east. All high speed approaches shall be to the north of the winch launch and pilot standing area and shall not carry into the launching or pilot standing area.
- All electric power sport planes (planes other than soaring types) shall be flown only to the north of the launching and pilot standing area when operating at low altitudes.
- 6. Hand launching of models (either for test gliding or thermal hunting) shall take piace to the north of the winch launch and pilot standing areas. (Obviously, a hand launch pilot does not have to stand in the normal pilot standing area).
- 7. Under most circumstances, launching models have right- of-way over sallplanes in flight; however, the bottom line is to maintain courtesy and consideration for others, whether you are flying or launching. (Note: right-of-way for launching models is an AMA rule for contest flying where the intention is to keep flying sallplanes from holding up launches and thus delaying the operation of a contest).
- 8. When other flyers are on your frequency, you should limit your flight to 15 minutes, unless prior arrangements have been made with the other flyers on the same frequency. This courtesy time !lmit also applies to electrics and hand launch thermal hunting, but is not intended to limit the number of hand launches. REMEMBER THAT COMMON COURTESY PREVAILS!
- 9. The AMA safety code requires your that model be identified with your name and address or AMA number on or in your model. (Note: For AMA sanctioned contests, all nonscale/non-indoor models "... shall be identified by the contestant's AMA license number permanently affixed to the upper side of the right hand lifting surface ... (with the) height of the numerals... (being) at least one inch or 1/3 of the wing root chord, whichever is less."
- Visiting pilots from other clubs are welcome on a limited basis with proof of AMA insurance.
- 11. Beginner pilots are welcome and we will offer help in learning to fly. Non-AMA members should not be encouraged to fly on their own, nor be allowed to do so during normal dub flying sessions. They must be supervised by a responsible member of the dub for insurance liability purposes.



Karl Hawley reminds us that we are in an environmental area therefore we should not throw trash around.


Roger McGregor submitted plans to the City for installing power to the storage container. If approved, we need volunteers to help trench, pull wire and install a battery box.

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


# Yorba Linda Slope Soaring

If you live in North Drange Lounty and don't know about Yoron Linda, then here is your chance to slope close to home. Slider Point along the South Ridge of Chino Hills State Park is actually located along the West and of Yoron Linda. This under utilized site faces South/SouthWest and typically comes alive sometime after 1:00 o'clock. The bowl below the point provides a deep




lift zone along with towering thermal action.



but it's worth the effort.


Getting there is relatively easy. Exit Yorba Linda Blvd either off the 57 or 91 fwy's. Travel East off the 57 or West off the 91 about 4 or 5 miles. At Fairmont Ave (near Chick's Sporting Goods) turn North toward the hills. Travel up the hill and make a left on Rim Crest. At the top of the street park on the right hand side with the rest of the cars. Wear comfortable shoes and walk into the small, unmanned gate. Glider Point is 0.4 miles up the hill on the left hand side. I hope you enjoy this place as much as I do.



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
#### SC2 At HS5









### Visalia 1998 Remembered

Even if your not flying the contest, there are a large number of vendors selling all kinds of good stuff. This is the place to be so some on an issuest follow the map below:


