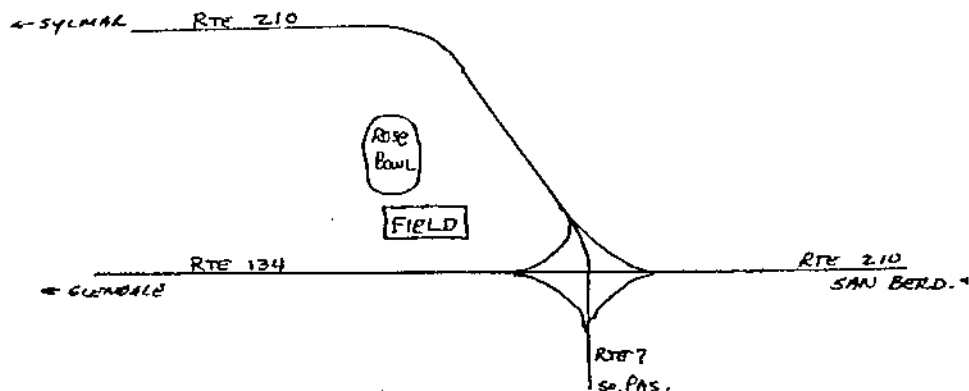


NONSENSE

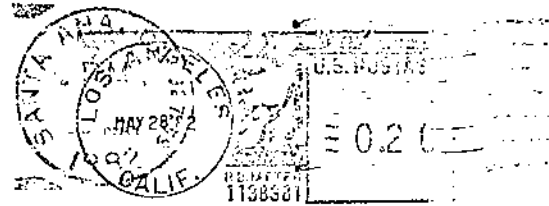
