
Everyone is encouraged to bring an interesting plane, or in-process pieces of any hot new projects that you may be working on.


Giant Scale Gliders at El Toro

Dennis Brandt says that they usually fly these giant scale gliders after about 2 PM at El Toro. The planes are often towed aloft with a 15 HP radio controlled model referred to as a "tug".

Dan Redfern of Model Machining Service, who produces the Inner Driven Gear Drives recently brought his new Modeltech P-47 to Fairview Park. This plane is a work of art, assembled by Russ Greaves who works for Hobby People. This plane is BIG, with a 67 inch wing span and is intended for .60 cu. in. engines. Dan uses one of his Mini Demon gear drives with a Mega 22/30/2 motor geared to 4:1. He uses 16 Gold Peak 3300 cells which provide about 50 amps at full throttle with a 16" x 10" prop. Of course it cruises at significantly less current. The plane has factory retracts and weighs in at about 8.7 lbs. Dan says the plane is very nice to fly. It has no bad habits and is a delightful slow floater during landings. Who says electric's can't be large? And, this is done with only a medium sized motor and a pretty small gear box. Looks like those Inner Demon reduction drives really do the job. Dan can be reached at (949) 631-2982, and his products can be seen at www.innerdemon.com. ADOPT-A-SCHOOL STATUS REPORT

For Month of August 2003 (Submitted 2 Sept 2003)

Radio controlled model aircraft flight training classes began 11 August 2003 at the Boys and Girls Club of Huntington Valley. The class started with a large enrollment which has finally reduced to a manageable size after 5 classes. We began with 4 one hour ground school classes on Mondays and Thursdays. The actual flying classes which are conducted at the soccer field adjacent to the club are generally 2 hours. As of Labor Day, classes will only be on Thursdays (during school). A total of 10 students have received their AMA Licenses, and three have had multiple flights on gliders and electric powered trainers. Most fortunately, Allen Long has agreed to be an assistant flight instructor. He has training experience and works quite well with the children. While not presently an HSS member, his help has been exceptional. Also note, a second series of classes at the club is under consideration, but they have a lot less activity during autumn through spring.

Joseph Romero, an instructor at Heninger Elementary School, is continuing to develop our program at his school. While classes have not yet been scheduled, he has obtained a donated computer and has personally purchased the RealFlight simulator for his school.

Our Adopt-A-School program with Fountain Valley School District for their Teen Activities Program (TAP) under the supervision of Jennifer De Sousa will not be starting until late September or early October.

Carl Marony of the AMA legal staff promises completion of their review of our revised Club and Instructor Release Agreement by the end of August.


