RADIO IMPOUND RULES

- 1- Mever turn on a transmitter without a frequency pin.
- 2- Place transmitter, by frequency color or channel # in rows.
- 3- When your transmitter comes to the front of row and your frequency pin is on the board You Fly.
- 4- After flying, return Frequency pin to beard, place transmitter behind those in your row with antennae collasped.
- 5- Make sure transmitter switch is OFF.
- 6- If you need a name tag on your transmitter ask for one.
- ** NOTE: In case of colors or channel that appear on the same pin. They will be considered same frequency and go in the same row.

FIELD SAFETY RULES (Think, Safety)

- 1- Avoid flying over the Pit area.
- 2- All launches will take place westerly from the launch area.

EXCEPTION:

Electric powered planes in South winds may launch from the South edge of the landing area East of pit area - Away from people.

- 3- Stand in Pilot area when flying. No flying from Pit area.
- 4- All approaches to landing area from the North of East.
- 5- Sport planes (Electric Power)) will be flown to the North of launch area.
- 6- No hand launching in landing area. Do so to the North of landing area. Do Not interfere with landing aircraft.
- 7- When others are on your frequency, Flights should be limited to 15 minutes to 20 minutes unless you are going for L.S.F. goal or you have made arrangements with those pilots.
- 8- Visiting Pilots Welcome !
- 9- Beginning pilots will recieve help in launching for 3 week-ends then membership would be appreciated.
- 10- The AMA safety code requires you have your name and address or AMA number on or in your plane.
- 11- Above all if you need or want help . Please ask.

The rules and guidelines are not to embarrass of affend. Just to help make our sport a safe one.
