## ( Rules and guidelines continue)

- 12. Scores for the year, top 10 awards will be based upon each contest normalized to 1,000 points.
- 13. All contest tasks will be submitted to the board for approval.
- 14. Sign-ups for each contest will be stated with the announced tasks of a contest.
- 15. Persons who supply a winch for a club contest will receive \$2.00 per contest. Winch line to be supplied by the club when needed.

The following will be brought up at the meeting for discussion and possible adoption by the club. Of all the proposals that I have seen or heard about, this is the first one that makes me feel more than, "Beginner" "Novice" "Tyro" "BOOT". Sportsman. Now that has a nice ring about it. And the rest of it makes senge too. Think about it.

## CRITERIA FOR ESTABLISHING FLYING CLASSIFICATION

- 1) There will henceforth be three flying classifications; SPORTSMAN, ADVANCED, and EXPERT, EXPERT being the highest skilled and SPORTSMAN being the least skilled.
- 2) Each classification will be determined by the following:
  - \* EXPERT --- Norminalized scores of at least five previous club contests with a score of 900 or better.
  - \* ADVANCED--- Norminalized scores of less than 900 points but more than 700 points of five contests.
  - \* SPORTSMAN--- Never has had five contests scores of 700 or more norminalized points. New members are in this classification.
- 3) Non members at club concests will automaticly be flying against the EXPERT classification.
- 4) Three 1st place wins of the ADVANCED or SPORTSMAN classification will automaticly move the member into the next higher skilled classification.
- 5) 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for each classification will be awarded.
- 6) One overall award will be given to the winner of a one flight flyoff among the 1st place winners of each classification of each contest. The CD of that contest will determine the task.
