DUES FOR 1983

Well it's that time of year again. Our dues structure for 1983 will be as follows:

Senior membership - \$15.00 per year pro rated (reduced by) \$1.00 per month to a minimum of \$6.00 from October to December 1983.

Junior membership - (16 yrs. & under) \$6.00 per year, not pro rated (\$6.00 all year).


